The Sahuarita building code adopts by reference the following national codes of the International Code Council, Inc. and National Fire Protection Association, Inc. as amended. International Building Code 2012 Edition with (ICC/ANSI A117.1-03 Accessible and usable building and facilities), International Residential Code 2012 Edition with appendix requirements, E, F, G. 1993 Outdoor Lighting Code Rancho Sahuarita Specific Plan	Provides standards for outdoor lighting so that its use does not unreasonably interfere with astronomical observations. Encourages conservation of energy without decreasing safety, utility, security and productivity while enhancing nighttime enjoyment of property within the Town. This Outdoor Lighting Code applies only to the area of the Rancho Sahuarita Specific Plan.
2012 Outdoor Lighting Code Ordinance # 2004-09 Town Code Chapter 15.05	Provides standards for outdoor lighting so that its use does not unreasonably interfere with astronomical observations. Encourages conservation of energy without decreasing safety, utility, security and productivity while enhancing nighttime enjoyment of property within the Town. This Outdoor Lighting Code applies to the entire Town with the exception of the Rancho Sahuarita Specific Plan.

Regional Solar Program	Provides standardized process for residential photovoltaic permits. The process is intended to simplify the structural and electrical review of residential photovoltaic systems.
Self-Certification Program	Provides criteria for design professionals in responsible charge to self-certify the building plans after the first review.
Special Inspections Standard Operating Procedure	Provides requirements for special inspections for residential and commercial permits.
Fireworks Ordinance # 2011-049 Town Code Chapter 8.20	Provides requirements for display firework permits and allows the use of consumer fireworks within the Town unless prohibited from time to time by Town Council.
